

Board of Managers News: A thousand dollars has been paid out to each of our four mission partners (Mission Aviation Fellowship; Hospital Chaplaincy; Homes of Hope; Wycliff Bible Translators); Our hall is not earthquake prone (a building with less than 34% of New Building Standard is deemed unsafe) and can therefore be safely used, but might need bracing of the piles – we are working through a process with the engineers and builders; We are concerned about our income and are working on getting more people to rent our hall; the team is working on preparing everyone's charitable donation receipts so you can claim back 33% from IRD if you wish.

Offering, tithe envelopes or cash, can be put in the box on the stand behind the pew as you enter the church.
