

We live in a society where we often have contradicting views about the same thing - all claiming to be right and offering supporting anecdotes and evidence.

The Christian message, the Good News, seem to have become a view among many which people either take note of or not. Religion seems to be fading into the background. In the 2018 census nearly half of all New Zealanders indicated that they had no religion.




In a world full of god's and temples and religions, Jesus came and brought God's Word to us. People began believing and following Jesus' teaching. According to Acts 9:2 one of the first terms people used to refer to Christians was 'followers of the Way' or 'people of the Way'.

"The first believers were renowned not for what they believed, but for the way they lived. Their lives were their credo; it spoke louder than words. Their profession was a daily experience. Other people saw how they loved the Lord and one another, and how they helped those who suffered. Their magnetic lifestyle was their testimony. That was why they became known as people of the Way – Jesus' way. Their faith made their relationships shine." ¹

Perhaps when we want to share with others what it means to be God's people it should be more about how we are and what we do, than about what we say. Can other people see how much we love the Lord and one another. Can people see we are motivated and inspired by Christ's love in how we reach out to people in need. Are we renowned as people of the Way in our community?



As a follow up from the previous Manawa, included is summary of St Enoch's Profit and Loss Accounts for the Year-to-Date January 2021.

The actual figures are compared with the budget. It will be seen from the statement when compared with the budget the Church is ahead in giving income and sundry income.

And with expenses well below what was expected it has resulted in a profit of \$3,782.

An excellent result when it was expected we would be running at a loss of \$9898.

It should be noted the income from intern sponsorship and the expense of the intern has been excluded from this profit and Loss account. It will be reported on in the next Manawa.

Just another reminder, If you are contributing to the church in cash or using the envelope system, please consider paying your offering each month via an Automatic Payment.

If you would like to change to make automatic payments, but need assistance please call myself or Marie and we will be only too happy to assist.

With the Banks phasing out Cheques and trying to reduce the amount of cash that they handle. AP's are a good alternative to writing out cheques or withdrawing cash to make a church donation.

Let us all look out for one another.



Church Maintenance - Our church has taken on a fresh new look now that the rotting fascia boards have been replaced and painted along with the soffits around the whole building.


Gardens - I hope you have seen the beautiful Sunflowers while in full bloom along the front of the church. Thank you, John.

Great investment opportunity!





(Matthew 6:18 - "Then no one will notice that you are fasting, except your Father, who knows what you do in private. And your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.")

The book that wasn't meant to be there

It was my birthday, 10 years ago and I had arrived back in the country from Rarotonga, where I had been giving a hand to our family who had a new baby. I always enjoy the short walk from the international terminal to the national one and felt happy to be back. It had been a very worthwhile time in Rarotonga but now I was looking forward to finishing off my birthday at home with John.

My bags were checked in and loaded on the plane and I waited with fellow passengers for the boarding announcement. But then, suddenly everything came to a halt. Every plane in the country was grounded, for it was 1pm on the 22nd of February 2011 and a massive earthquake had hit Christchurch. The air control centre for the country was based in Christchurch and had stopped all operations.

I watched in shock and disbelief as scenes of chaos played out on the large tv screens. This was a city I knew so well, where I had been at high school and university. This is where John and I were married and where we still had extended family and friends living. I saw buildings I knew crumbling before my eyes. It was a nightmare.

For a moment no one seemed to know quite what to do, or whether our plane might still be going, but eventually we were called to retrieve our bags from the carousel. I was going nowhere.

People thronged the terminal, and I imagine the scene at the international one was incredible. Everyone was trying to find some means of accommodation as it was obvious, we weren't going to be getting on a plane that day. We were told to contact the airline and rebook a flight. Fortunately, I was able to get hold of John and he managed to do this for me. He got me on one later the next day.

In the meantime... where would I stay? We do have friends in Auckland, but I couldn't get hold of them. I tried all the freephone numbers for hotels but the answer was the same...no room. All those multi roomed hotels near the airport were totally booked out.

It felt a bit lonely and frightening.

I contemplated a night spent sleeping on a not very comfortable seat in the airport. I had done that years before, when, for various reasons, John and I had missed our flight in New York and spent time on benches at La Guardia airport. I could do it again! I told myself. But that time someone came round with a blanket for me, and early in the morning there was a cart with coffee and donuts. They must have been used to travellers missing planes.

As I sat drinking a cup of tea from the cafe, a thought came into my mind. I would go to the bookshop at the other end of the terminal and check out the tourist books of accommodation in NZ. It was a last-ditch attempt, but I would try it.

On the shelves I found one that listed B&Bs in Auckland and had one just near the airport. I felt it most unlikely there would be a room available, but I had nothing to lose so I dialled the number. As it happened the owner told me, there had just been a cancellation and there was one room left. Would I like her to pick me up from the airport? Would I?!!!! I surely would!!

As we drove to the B&B the kind woman asked, with curiosity in her voice, "how did you find out about my place?" "It was listed in a book in Whitcoulls" I replied. There was a moment pause. "But I am not listed in this year's book" she said, they must have had an older edition on the shelves.

Well, I said "I think you are my angel for today!" I was so grateful.

My birthday "dinner" was a muesli bar and a glass of water eaten while I sat on my bed in a tiny room, watching, mesmerised, replay after replay footage from Christchurch.

There was horror, there was chaos and sadness, but I was one small person who had been provided with a place of shelter in the midst of the storm.

It makes me think of our current situation. There are many "storms" raging around us. There was the sudden, totally unexpected, "earthquake" of Covid-19 pandemic in 2020, changing our world. There are issues of our what is happening to our climate and what the future holds for us. and for all creation.

I can't remember specifically praying about my situation in the airport, though I think sometimes simply an inner "HELP!" is a prayer. Yet I feel sure that God did hear me and did answer my unspoken prayer. I believe I was guided to that book, which shouldn't still have been on the shelf.

I think the verses of this psalm could hardly be more appropriate. Psalm 46 v1-2 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea".

What I learned at that time is that God can truly be our refuge and strength no matter what the outward circumstances. That is a treasure I carry with me always.


The old man hangs up his phone and turns to his wife. "Okay", he says, "it's all set. They're both coming for Christmas and paying their own air-fare."



New Milestones in Digital Scripture Availability

Recent years have seen a dramatic and steady increase in the number of Scripture translations available digitally via websites and smartphone apps. In October 2020 You Version reached a new milestone, with Scriptures now available in a total of 1,500 languages. Globally, digital Scriptures in a total of 1,968 languages became available on various sites and apps.

Scriptures are now available in an increasingly wide variety of forms, including print, audio and video. And the numbers of languages in which Scripture can be accessed through various formats continues to grow. In 2014, YouVersion celebrated the 1,000th version available on its platform, and the 2,000th in 2019. The 1,000th individual language was reached in 2016, and as of 29 October 2020 they offer 2,200 versions in 1,500 languages. (See bible.com/en-GB/languages for the latest list.)




Faith Comes By Hearing has made similar progress, currently providing Scripture in about 1,500 languages. While their primary focus has been on audio recordings of Scriptures, in the last few years they have added videos, first in partnership with the JESUS film and now also with the Lumo partnership, through which they have committed to creating at least one Gospel film in every recorded language. All of these are made available via the Bible.is site and app.



Other sources of online Scripture include sites supported by the American Bible Society and linked through global.bible and many other individual sites and apps. (The number for Android apps below is just the number we know about.)

And so, between the various sites and platforms we are quickly approaching 2,000 languages in which Scripture will be available digitally. This rises even higher if we include JESUS films in languages which do not (yet) have any other Scripture online.



The Vision of the Wycliffe Global Alliance is to see “Individuals, communities and nations transformed through God’s love and Word expressed in their languages and cultures.” A completed translation is rightly a cause for celebration, not simply as a static publication, but because it opens the way for people to engage with God through his Word in their own language and to be transformed through that encounter.



Minette's Travels


It is so good to follow Minette on her travels around New Zealand.


